FACTSHEET INFORMATION

Summary of Invasiveness

- Starry Stonewort is a submerged annual macro-algae that is known to form large, dense mats within waterbodies.
- These mats reduce the diversity of other aquatic plants, block the movement of water and wildlife, and impede spawning activities.
- Damage caused by this plant can also negatively impact recreational opportunities such as swimming, fishing, and boating.

Description

- Submerged annual macro-algae.
- Whorls of 4-6 thin, bright green branchlets are arranged around the stem and vary in length.
- White, star-shaped bulbils the size of a grain of rice are attached to the base of the plant via clear threads
- Small, orange spheres may be seen at the tips of the branchlets.
- Clear filaments anchor the algae to the sediment.

Introduction and Movement

- Starry Stonewort is native to Eurasia, and was unintentionally introduced via contaminated ballast water.
- It inhabits slow moving waters such as lakes, reservoirs, ponds, rivers, and can easily spread through fragmentation and distribution by recreational activities and wildlife.

Prevention Strategy

- To prevent accidental introductions, learn how to identify Starry Stonewort and report any sightings.
- Always research aquarium plants before purchasing.
- Never release aquarium contents or water garden species into surface waters and dispose of unwanted vegetation by burning, composting, or drying out completely.
- When boating, make sure to clean off any vegetative materials when leaving each waterbody, and before launching into another.
